

## Blakeney Sailing Club Autumn briefing 2011

### Sailing

It has been a mixed year for sailing. A bright, dry and warm spring gave way to a somewhat mixed summer with some unusual winds, followed by a very warm autumn. There was too much wind for the international 14 meeting and there was too little for the North West Norfolk Week. The first day of the Blakeney Regatta had good weather but the second day it was too windy and racing was postponed until the following weekend. The wind blew all week until an hour before the start whereupon it disappeared. The Morston Regatta had good conditions and a lot of participants took to the water. The midweek racing week saw favourable sailing conditions and a good number of boats taking part. The final weekend sailing in mid October concluded a very pleasant autumns sailing.

### Fun week/social activities

The fun week had a variety of social sailing activities around the harbour as well as a number of non sailing events, these included Bike rides, walks and tennis as well as the inaugural Cockles V. BSC cricket match which, I am pleased to report, BSC just won. For the first time we had a golf tournament, during the afternoon of one of the race week days, which was well attended. The annual Hog Roast filled the Cley Village Hall to capacity and the raffle, which had some very generous prizes provided by local businesses, raised a record amount of money for the club.

### Engines

As I reported in the last newsletter, thieves stole our two outboard engines in early June. We made a successful claim on our insurance and have replaced one of the engines, and, whilst we are working out how best to secure the engines in the long term, Alan Robinson has very kindly temporarily loaned us another engine. Both engines are currently being removed from the rescue boats after use. On a more positive note the new racing mark buoys have proven to be a great success and we will be purchasing more for next season.

### Sailing Schedule of 2012

Now that the tide table has been published for next year we can begin to organise the sailing schedule for 2012. As you know the schedule needs to take into account the times and heights of the tides, but we also need to ensure that we get a good balance between the need to man the rescue boat, the committee boat and to provide sufficient racing and social sailing for all members.
